Anythink Commerce City renovations will include a 2,300-square-foot addition to the existing building with a new entry plaza facing the corner of $72^{\rm nd}$ and Monaco; a children's pavilion, computer lab and teen area; and a reading nook with fireplace looking out onto a small enclosed garden. The children's pavilion will include glass walls looking out onto an outdoor children's area and the coveted cottonwood tree, which has been a part of the site since before the original library was built. Renovations are scheduled for completion in fall 2010.
